In light of the tragic police killings of Daunte Wright and Adam Toledo, and the abusive policing of Lt. Caron Nazario that we witnessed this week, the Downers Grove Public Library stands by its previous statements condemning the actions and systemic racism that continually harm our Black and brown communities.

The compounded trauma of Daunte Wright's senseless death, which occurred roughly 10 miles from George Floyd's horrific final moments, is significant. Black Lives Matter. The Black community's pain, fear, and anger is real.

We extend our deepest sympathy and support to the family, friends, and communities of Daunte Wright, Adam Toledo, and Lt. Caron Nazario. The library strongly supports our Black and brown community members and staff. The library will continue to work on being an ally for our Black and brown community members.
